

Expected Competencies:

- Students will demonstrate knowledge of modern scientific approaches to psychopathology, assessment, and intervention.
- Students will perform successfully in required courses in these areas and will demonstrate understanding of the scientific foundations of clinical practice in clinical activities.
- Students will demonstrate an understanding of and basic competence in application of research tools and design.
- Students will demonstrate understanding of ethics and professional issues.
- Students will demonstrate knowledge and competence in psychological assessment.
- Students will successfully complete the required clinical courses into which these issues are integrated and will have satisfactory evaluations of professional and ethical conduct.
- Students will be able to demonstrate knowledge of ethical guidelines and display solid problem-solving skills when confronted with ethical situations in clinical and research settings.
